### City Directories

City directories are fascinating and greatly under-used by genealogical researchers. Historically city directories have been chiefly used as an aid of locating individuals at a particular address at a particular time and for little else. There is no question that is important to know the exact address of city dwellers, particularly when we are trying to locate a census ward or district, a draft registration board. However, city directories may tell us so much more. When you locate city directories containing individuals in your family, you are urged to wring them dry.

The directories can provide us with wonderful clues and information about our ancestors—don't just look to see if your ancestor is listed among the alpha list of inhabitants. If the 1868 Lowell, Massachusetts, City Directory had not been searched page by page, we would have missed the delightful ad shown here for Henry M. Woodward, mason. Likewise we would not have seen the 1866 ad for the Gent's Furnishing Store of A.G. Woodward (see page 35 of this issue of *WOODWARDS WeSearch*). Searching the Lowell (Massachusetts) city directories available from 1861 to 1881, we can learn several things about Alfred G. Woodward. We learn that he resided at 14 Stackpole from 1861 through 1868; by 1870 he was residing on Third St.; and he moved again in 1872 to East Merrimac St. where he remained through 1881. We might also surmise that Alfred G. Woodward lost his clothing business—from 1861 to 1875 he is consistently recorded as being in the clothing business; in the 1878 directory the Alfred G. Woodward had a partner, Nathaniel Churchill, Jr.; and in 1880 Alfred G. Woodward is a clerk at a different location. Although information contained within city directories will vary from place to place and year to year, they contain a smorgasbord of information. Some of the common elements contained within city directories are

- Residence of individuals (street address and sometimes postal addresses)
- Occupation and place of employment (generally part of the residential list)
- Reverse listings of residents by street address (sometimes called a householder's index)
- Business directory
- Advertisements

- Civil & fraternal organizations (often including names of those in leadership positions)
- Churches (sometimes including a list of communicants)
- City and/or County Officials
- Transportation Schedules (railroads, steam ships, stage coaches, etc.)
- Cemeteries

Diligent reading of a series of directories, say at least ten to twenty years, may provide us with plentiful clues concerning the social and economic conditions of ancestors as well as the community. Some of the things we need to look for are

- All individuals with the same surname, particular those residing at the same address
- Widow's listing, which may provide the name of her deceased husband and his occupation
- Check the advertising indexes for the surname and the places of employment.
- Clues for a family's first listing (may indicate arrival) or last listing (may indicate removal from the city or death) in the directory



### Some Pitfalls

Although they are generally associated with larger cities, smaller communities may be included in the directory of a neighboring city. On occasion county directories were also produced—for example the *La Salle County [Illinois] General Directory for 1872-3* (Joliet, Ill.: R.F. Keyes & Co.,

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## 1880 Alabama Soundex Part I

The following are abstracts of Woodwards (including spelling variations) found in the 1880 Alabama Soundex (Code W363, National Archives micropublication T734, reel 69). The abstracts are in the same order in which they appear on the microfilm.

When using these abstracts to locate the 1880 U.S. Census, Population Schedules, for Alabama families, it is important to remember that in 1880 only families with at least one child age ten or younger were index. There is no comprehensive index for all families.

The data for each family includes; Name; Race of the primary individual; Relationship to head of house (or name of family with whom the individual is residing); Age; and Birth place. These entries are followed by County of residence; ED (Enumeration District), and Sheet number. The term "n.r." indicates that the information was "not recorded;" and "e/w"

represents the phrase "enumerated with."

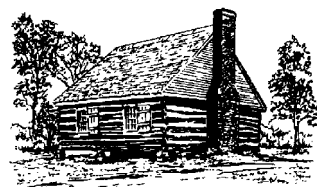

1872).

The accuracy of city directories is sometimes questionable. We need to remember that the publication dates are often off as much as a year from when the data was compiled. Sometimes individuals were required to submit a fee if they were to be included in the directory (inclusion by subscription)—if the individual is not in the directory when a fee was required, he/she may not have been able to, or did not want to, pay the fee. We should always check the table of contents for "addendum." The addendum will carry some last minute additions and/or corrections which have come to the attention of the publisher just prior to printing.

### Repositories

The Library of Congress, the American Antiquarian Society, The New England Historic Genealogical Society, and the New York Public Library are commonly known as having the largest collections of city directories. Generally the best collections for a particular city or region will be found at the local public library, local genealogical or historical society. Large collections may also be found at university libraries, state libraries, and state archives.

Many city directories have been preserved in microform. *City Directories of the United States, 1860-1901: Guide to the Microfilm Collection* [Woodbridge, Conn.: Research Publications, 1983]. The title of this book is uncharacteristically more limited than many of the actual entries. When using this text to determine existing city directories on microfilm for Lowell, Massachusetts, for example, we found a fairly complete series of directories on microfiche or microfilm from 1833-1901. Obviously, the restrictive title of the text indicating 1860-1901 is understated. Most large public libraries and university libraries have the collection of city directories provided by Research Publications.

Microfilm of city directories may be rented from the Family History Library at a local branch library or rented from the American Genealogical Lending Library (AGLL now part of Heritage Quest - [www.heritagequest.com](http://www.heritagequest.com)). AGLL has over three hundred six directories for Vermont alone, but many of them are for the twentieth century. You may also want to determine if city directories in which you have interest may be obtained through interlibrary loan at your local library.

Many city directories have been digitized and placed on the World Wide Web. City Directories Online ([www.citydirectories.com](http://www.citydirectories.com)) boasts directories for ninety-nine cities, but only six directories may be searched free of charge, to access the entire collection requires a fee.

In summary, we must remember that directories will tell us much more than a particular address. If we are diligent in our searches then our rewards will be many.
