American Memory Collection

The Library of Congress (LOC) website should be bookmarked by every family historian who works with the internet. The LOC site is a prime source of delightful records. The focus of this article is on their American Memory collections.

American Memory Historical Collections is a gateway to rich primary source materials relating to the history and culture of the United States. Currently the site offers more than seven million digital items from more than 100 historical collections.

The Collection Finder allows visitors to search all collections at once, search a selected group of collections, or select a single collection. Searching the total collection for "Woodward" produces five hundred items while a search for Woodward produced forty items. I've selected a couple of items to describe for you.

Willis Woodward & Co., New York published sheet music. One of their songs was Sheffer&Blakely's *Liza Loves You* which was a selection from the theater musical "The Wrong Girl." This item was enumerated in the African-American Sheet Music, 1850-1920, collection.

This History of the American West, 1860-1920: Photographs from the Collection of the Denver Public Library produced a smashing studio portrait, head and shoulders, of Frank Lincoln Woodward, a Denver Lawyer who served as president of the Denver Symphony Orchestra, and president of Denver Federation for Charity and Philanthropy.

City Directories – A Summary

The July 2000 issue of this newsletter contains a brief article concerning City Directories. Consequently, what is said here is in the way of a brief over-views of their usefulness.

It is rather obvious that city directories are useful tools for locating a specific address for our ancestors, particularly those dwelling in large cities. This is one of the main reasons many of us will want to consult them prior to search the 1930 U.S. Census.

City Directories contain a lot more information than the residential address (and sometimes employment address) of our ancestors. The amount and variety of information will vary from city to city and sometimes year to year, but we can generally expect to find an individual's occupation, and whether the occupant is a homeowner, or a boarder at a particular address. The enumeration of the citizens is by far the bulk of the data in a city directory. Directories often provide other sections of information concerning the community including the names and address of religious organizations and churches, schools, civic and fraternal organizations, government offices, businesses, etc. Reverse street indexes are a terrific source for identifying neighbors. Maps are also often welcome additions to city directories. Advertisements provide a wonderful source where we may learn about the products and services that were presented by our ancestors.

Perhaps the first city directory in what is now these United States was compiled in Baltimore, Maryland about 1752. In 1782 a directory was published for Charleston, South Carolina. Extant city directories of the United States through 1860 are available in microform at most large libraries. Many other directories are available on microfilm and may be rented at local branches of the Family History Library. More modern directories for specific locations are often available in regional libraries.

Other Directories may also be useful:

- County and regional business directories
- Post office and street directories
- Professional directories
- Religious directories
- Telephone directories

Probate Packet of Levi Woodward (1846)

Part I

All family historians and genealogists are eager to find a will, particular one in which the testator names family members. Once that "will" is found, however, many researchers, thinking they have found all they need, leave the probate search and move on to other matters. Stop! Look! and Listen!

In this article, to be continued, contains abstracts of the documents and a brief discussion of some hypotheses that might be made concerning the life and times of Levi Woodward.

Levi Woodward's will was admitted to probate in LaSalle County, Illinois, on 11 December 1846. His probate packet contains four original documents consisting of 11 sheets

- Last Will and Testament of Levi Woodward
- A Schedule of articles allowed for the widow and minor children to the exclusion of creditors
- Appraisement Bill of the personal property of the estate of Levi Woodward, deceased
- Note signed by Betsey Clarke refusing to act as executor of the estate of Levi Woodward

1) *Summary (abstract) of the Last Will and Testament of Levi Woodward:*

Probate packet of Levi Woodward, Box W (1836-1890); 1847 #13; LaSalle County Genealogy Guild, 115 W. Grover St., Ottawa, Illinois.

Levi Woodward, of LaSalle County, Illinois, signed his last will and testament on 10 November 1846 in the presence of Ezra Ids and Hemon Harwood who signed the document as subscribing witnesses.

Bequeaths:

- "to my dear wife Betsey Woodward" all real estate consisting of 120 acres of land on which he now lives and all of my personal property (subject to reservations hereinafter described).
It was ordered that both real and personal property be sold at the discretion of his wife (and executrix) Betsey.
The above to be in affect as long as Betsey remained his widow.
- In the case that Betsey remarry, the entire estate, both real and personal, was to be equally divided among "my children," except for a certain trunk and its contents and the household furniture.
- All just debts against the estate should be paid by the executrix out of assets of the estate as soon after his decease as practicable.
- His minor children Mary A. and Caroline E. Woodward were to be assisted in their support out of "this Estate" by my wife as long as they are minors.
- Betsey Woodward, his wife, was appointed sole executrix.

On 11 December 1846 when Ezra Ids and Herman Harwood swore in open court that Levi Woodward was of sound mind and memory

and that he signed his will and they signed as witnesses in their presences and in the presence of each other.

The document was recorded and filed 23 June 1867

Hypotheses

- Levi Woodward died between 10 November 1846 when he signed his will and 23 June 1867 when his will was recorded and filed.
- Levi by 10 November 1846 had married a woman named Betsey (Elizabeth?), maiden name unknwn. It is not known whether Levi had been married more than once.
- On 10 November 1846, Levi had two minor children who where to be assisted in their support by Betsey. The children may or may not be the children of Betsey.

2) *Summary of the "sole nad exclusive property" allowed the widow and minor children was submitted on 20 September 1847*

A SCHEDULE and estimate of the value of each article of specific property allowed by the statute, in exclusion of creditors, to the Widow or Children of persons whose estates are administered upon in the State of Illinois, as their sole and exclusive property forever, viz:

Necessary beds, bedsteads, and bedding, for the family of the deceased - \$35

Necessary household and kitchen furniture - \$36

One spinning wheel - \$3

One loom and it appendages - \$8

One pair of cards - 75¢

One stove and the necessary pipe therefore - \$18

Wearing apparel of the family - \$50

One milk cow with calf, one for every four persons in the family - \$12.50

One horse, at the value of forty dollars - \$40

One woman's saddle and bridle of the value of fifteen dollars - \$15

Provisions for the family for one year - \$78

Six sheep, two for each member of the family - \$6

Fleeces taken from the same - \$4.50

Food for the stock above described for six months - \$15

Fuel for the family for three months - \$5

Sixty dollars worth of other property - \$60

The articles of specific property which were allowed for the widow's and/or minor children's support will vary depending upon the appraised value of the estate. Obviously, if the estate of the deceased did not include a woman's saddle and bridle, and did not contain livestock, those items might not be included within the schedule.

In the next issue the remaining documents within the probate packet of Levi Woodward of LaSalle County, Illinois, will be discussed.



WWI Draft Registrations - New Hampshire

The World War I Draft Registration card for all 24 million men are housed at the National Archives-Southeast Region in East Point, Georgia.

Generally the draft registrations were the function of the county, but not in New Hampshire. Here the draft registrations appear to have been the jurisdiction of larger cities and towns and are filed as such.

The abstracts below contain the name of the registrant, his birth date, residence, and draft board information including the date of registration.

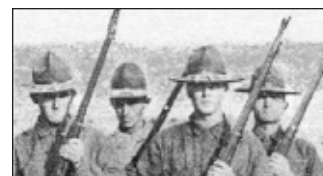
